(11 February 2019 – Hong Kong) Marking the 10th consecutive year of support for Operation Santa Claus (OSC) jointly organised by South China Morning Post (SCMP) and Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK) in 2018, HKSH Village Volunteers achieved a new record of over HK\$1.25 million donation together with the dollar-for-dollar matching from Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital (the Hospital).
